Sports Premium Expenditure 2016 – 2017

What is the Sports Premium Grant?

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding (Sports Premium) for physical education (PE) and sport in all maintained primary schools with pupils in Years 1 to 6. This funding must be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

It is awarded as a basic sum of £8000 with an additional £5 per pupil. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

From September 2014 schools have been required to publish on-line information about how they are using the Sports Premium. This is to ensure parents and other stakeholders are made fully aware of how the funding is used.

Rationale

Our priority in the academic year 2016-2017 is to use the money to provide as much benefit to our pupils as possible in addition to the opportunities already provided. These include two hours of curriculum time each which is dedicated to physical activity. Each term there is also a wide range of sporting clubs which include girls' and boys' football, netball, cross country, cricket, tag rugby, gymnastics, athletics etc. There are also opportunities for pupils to participate in competitive sporting events against other local schools including those for our disabled pupils.

Of note is the fact that, last year we achieved Gold in Active Mark for both Key Stages 1 and 2.

Top up swimming	<p>Top up swimming for pupils in Year 5 who despite experiencing the swimming lessons in younger years in the school are still unable to swim. The funding includes transport to and from the Littlehampton Swimming Centre and teaching by qualified swimming coaches.</p>	
Professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cover for teachers & support to attend training. For example, by attending conferences, delivering CPD to other members of staff and providing time for curriculum leaders to prepare, monitor and review action. • A number of focused courses for N.Q.T. including Gym and Games, Dance / Physical Literacy and Net Games.
